The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Harris County Emergency Services District No. 48 this year is \$248,153 (average taxable value of a residence homestead in the taxing unit for the current tax year, disregarding residence homestead exemptions available only to disabled persons or persons 65 years of age or older). If the governing body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of \$0.09774 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$242.54 (tax on average taxable value of a residence homestead in the taxing unit for the current tax year, disregarding residence homestead exemptions available only to disabled persons or persons 65 years of ge or older).

If the governing body adopts the proposed tax rate of \$0.10000 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$248.15 (tax on average

taxable value of a residence homestead in the taxing unit for the current tax year, disregarding residence homestead exemptions available only to disabled persons or persons 65 years of age or older).
